



Information about schooling in Sweden and Munkedal

Register with the Swedish Migration Agency

A residence permit under the EU's Mass Refugee Directive gives children up to the age of 18 the right to education in Sweden. In order to apply for a residence permit under the EU Mass Refugee Directive, the child in question needs to register with the Swedish Migration Agency.

School is not compulsory but an opportunity

Children from Ukraine do not have compulsory schooling in Sweden but the municipality is responsible for giving children who have fled Ukraine the opportunity to attend school on the same terms as other children living in Sweden if that is requested.

The language of education is Swedish

In Swedish schools, the teaching takes place in Swedish. When attending a Swedish school great focus will be preparing the child to take part in ordinary schooling by learning the Swedish language as quickly as possible.

Schools in Munkedal

In Munkedal there are four schooling districts with five compulsory schools for children from the age of six to the age of twelve. There is one compulsory school for children from the age of thirteen to the age of fifteen. In Munkedal there is also one compulsory school for children with severe learning disabilities.

After compulsory school in Sweden pupils can apply to upper secondary school. In Munkedal this education is located and organized by Kunskapens Hus in Dingle.
